

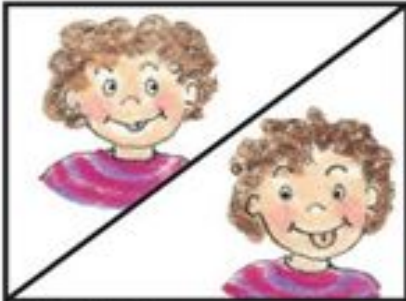
Jolly Phonics

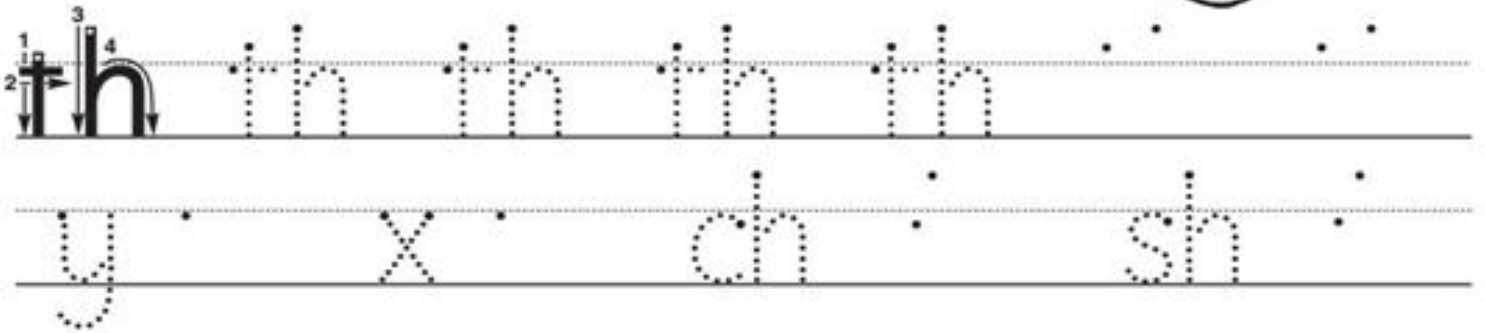
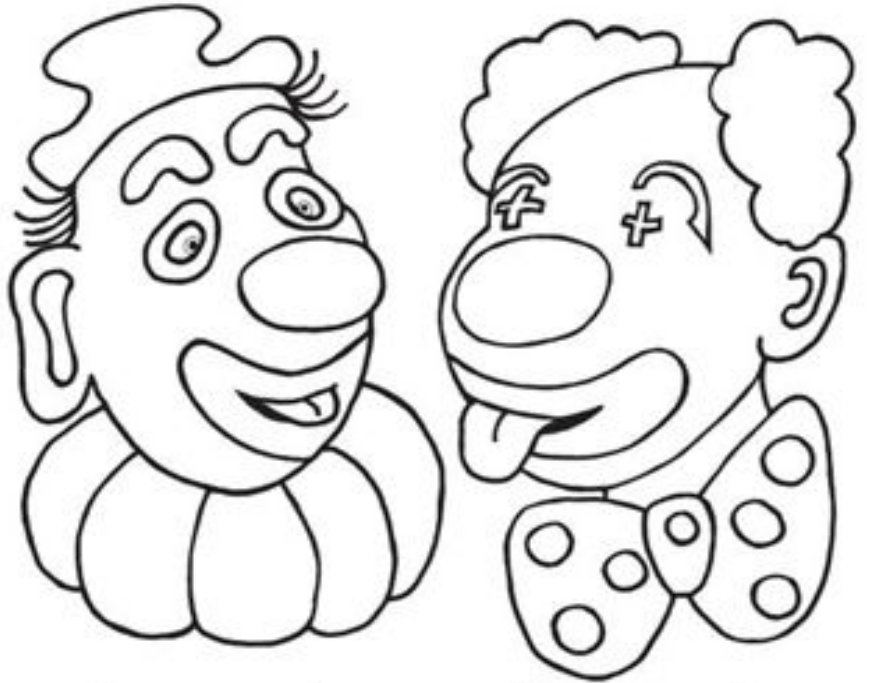

Pretend to be a rude clown and stick out your tongue a little for *th* (as in *this*), and further for *th* (as in *thumb*).

















Three of these pictures have a /th/ sound in them.
